Students coming from Korea and Taiwan

We are excited to inform you that two exchange students from our partner universities in Korea and Taiwan arrived in April for a semester-long study at Konan. During their stay in Japan, these students work under the guidance of the professors of the designated faculties and a language center advisor; they also take classes alongside Konan students.

Additional good news is that two students from the University of Leeds will soon arrive in Japan in order to participate in the Year-in-Japan program. Even though the pandemic previously forced us to start the program online, students are now very excited to start their university life here in Kobe.



SUMMER INTENSIVE JAPANESE PROGRAM

Intensive Japanese Language Course 27th May -17th July 2022

Although we were unable to provide our Summer Intensive Japanese Language Program in 2020 and 2021 due to the pandemic, we are pleased that we can now reopen our doors to international students following the Japanese government's relaxation of the COVID-19 border controls. Thus far, 30 students from our partner universities have applied for this summer's program. Although the program lasted 6 weeks before the pandemic, this year we are conducting a 7-week program which includes a one-week hotel stay to prepare for possible self-quarantine. We are looking forward to welcoming summer students to campus for the first time in two years, and we'll work to ensure that they will have plenty of lively exchanges with Konan students.
